## SECTION J - Junior Department Rules

- All Junior Exhibitors **12 years of age and under** pay no entry fee .Juniors age **13 to 17 years of age** must obtain a membership at a cost of \$3
- Fill out an entry form and register with the Secretary to receive an exhibitor number. Insert your age
- **See also** Art and Photography Sections and Baking #63 and #67
- During the Fair, **prize money** for Juniors may be picked up by submitting the pink copy of the entry form to the Secretary at the Town Park Recreation Centre. In order to claim your prize money after the Fair please contact the Secretary. See page 5
- Exhibits must be received at the Town Park Recreation Centre by **11am** Friday September 12 and picked up on Sunday September 14 between 4:30 and 6 pm
- The same person may not win the Prize Money awarded for the highest points for more than 2 consecutive years. Open Specials are excluded from this rule
- Only one entry per person per class and all work must be done by the exhibitor in the current year and suitably labelled. Parents are urged to allow the children to prepare the exhibit. Please encourage them in every way, but allow them to do the work themselves
- At the discretion of the judge, a 1st or any prize ribbon may not be awarded
- **All baking must be covered with plastic wrap and placed on disposable plates**
- Each entry will receive a ribbon
- In the general categories, judging is based upon creativity and appearance
- Point system for high point prizes: 1st - 3 points, 2nd - 2 points, 3rd - 1 point, 4th - 1 point
- Prize Money: 1st \$3, 2nd \$2, 3rd \$1, 4th \$.50. Fourth place is awarded if there are more than 10 entries or at the discretion of the judge

## 3 to 5 Years of Age at opening day of the Fair

### GENERAL

- 1 Decorated hat for a special celebration
- 2 Trace your hand or foot and decorate
- 3 Crayon drawing of an **apple** - no larger than 22 x 28 cm.
- 4 *Life on the farm* - a cut and paste picture no larger than 22X28 cm
- 5 Hand-made necklace made from anything (cereal, beads, yarn, pasta)
- 6 Hand-made birthday card
- 7 My favourite farm animal made from any kind of modelling material or clay
- 8 Dressed up hard-boiled egg in shell, in a suitable container
- 9 Spider creature made from pipe cleaners
- 10 Hand puppet made from a small paper lunch bag
- 11 Christmas tree decoration - ready to hang
- 12 Miscellaneous - not previously listed

### BAKING ( Judged on appearance only for this age group)

- 61 No bake cookies (3) or rice krispie creation
- 62 One large decorated cookie - no more than 15 cm in diameter. An adult may help make the cookie.

## 6 to 7 Years of Age at opening day of the Fair

### GENERAL

- 13 Decorated garden stone, about 15 cm in any direction
- 14 Hand-made jewellery such as hair ornament, necklace or bracelet
- 15 Hanging mobile or wind chimes
- 16 Cut and paste picture of an **apple** orchard
- 17 Article made from clothes pins or popsicle sticks
- 18 Recycle and create something useful from something discarded
- 19 Something made from "Lego" no larger than 24 cm square, own creation
- 20 Hand puppet made from a wooden spoon
- 21 Christmas tree decoration, ready to hang
- 22 Hand-made card for someone special
- 23 Wearable Hallowe'en mask made from anything
- 24 Miscellaneous - not previously listed

### BAKING (Judged on appearance only for this age group)

- 63 Ice and decorate a cupcake. An adult may make (or purchase) the cupcake.
- 64 One large decorated cookie - no more than 15 cm in diameter. An adult may help make the cookie.

## 8 to 10 Years of Age at opening day of the Fair

### GENERAL

- 25 Paper placemat for a special holiday or party celebration, 28 X 34 cm
- 26 A scrapbook page
- 27 Decorated straw hat
- 28 Painted jar with apple theme
- 29 Christmas tree decoration, ready to hang
- 30 Hand-made jewellery such as a hair ornament, necklace, or bracelet
- 31 T-shirt decorated with fabric paint
- 32 Something made from "Lego" with moving parts and no larger than 10" square
- 33 Seed Picture made of corn, sunflower and/or other seeds, no larger than 22 X 28 cm
- 34 **Apple head doll**
- 35 Creation (not a picture) made with the aid of a computer - e.g. jewellery or a 3 D structure
- 36 3 D display featuring an animal in its natural habitat - shoe box size
- 37 Miscellaneous - not previously listed

### BAKING (Judged on appearance only for this age group)

- 65 Sugar cookies cut into shapes, 3 on a plate, use own recipe
- 66 Ice and decorate a single layer 8 inch round cake or 3 cupcakes

## 11 to 13 Years of Age at opening day of the Fair

### GENERAL

- 38 A scrapbook page showing depicting apple season
- 39 Model - for example, a plane, boat, car or piece of dolls' house furniture
- 40 T-shirt decorated with fabric paint
- 41 Wreath using **apples** (fresh, dried and or craft apples may be used)
- 42 Article of origami (paper folding)
- 43 Three paper flowers with stems and displayed in vase or bottle
- 44 Hand-made jewellery such as a hair ornament, necklace or bracelet
- 45 Frame for a picture. Should include a photo or picture no larger than 22 X 28 cm
- 46 **Apple head doll**
- 47 'A small fuzzie' made with pom poms or fluff or other soft material
- 48 Potpourri - must include **apples**
- 49 Miscellaneous - not previously listed

### BAKING - Use your own recipes

- 67 Chocolate chip cookies - 3 on a plate. No larger than 3 inches/7.6 cm (Eligible for OAAS District competition)
- 68 Butterscotch chip cookies - 3 on a plate
- 69 **Apple muffins** - 2 on a plate, no liners

## 14 to 17 Years of Age at opening day of the Fair

### GENERAL

- 50 A scrapbook page
- 51 Hand-made jewellery - necklace, bracelet or earrings
- 52 Original poem - text and graphics with the aid of the computer - 22 X 28 cm
- 53 Original design for a CD or magazine cover made with or without the computer
- 54 Home-made bird feeder or bird house
- 55 Article made of pottery, podge or ceramic
- 56 Article made from wood
- 57 Machine or hand-sewn article with fabric sample attached
- 58 Article of knitting, embroidery, cross stitch or needlepoint
- 59 Wreath using **apples** (fresh, dried and or craft apples may be used)
- 60 Miscellaneous - not previously listed

### BAKING - Use your own recipes

- 70 Chocolate chip cookies - 3 on a plate. No larger than 3 inches/7.6 cm. (Eligible for OAAS District competition if 15 or under)
- 71 **Apple muffins** - 2 on a plate - no liners

### VEGETABLES AND FRUITS

- 72 Largest **apple**
- 73 Longest carrot
- 74 Largest vegetable or fruit - identify the type of vegetable or fruit (no pumpkins)
- 75 Pumpkin - no larger than 18 inches in diameter
- 76 4 varieties of **apples** labelled and displayed on a plate
- 77 Potatoes - 3 on a plate (dirt brushed off)
- 78 6 vegetable seeds labelled and displayed
- 79 6 different vegetables labelled and displayed
- 80 Most oddly shaped vegetable - identify the type of vegetable or fruit

### FLOWERS

- 81 Zinnias, 3 single
- 82 Sunflowers - 3 blooms
- 83 Marigolds - 3 blooms
- 84 Collection of wild flowers in a suitable container
- 85 Collection of fresh flowers (not wild flowers) in a suitable container
- 86 Small house plant

Tree not over 3 feet, decorated with primarily natural material. We suggest either a cedar or a small potted tree. It must be able to stand.

Winning entries will be displayed in the *Little Lords & Ladies* shop window following the Fair.
