SECTION J - Junior Department Rules

- All Junior Exhibitors **12 years of age and under** pay no entry fee. Juniors age **13 to 17 years of age** must obtain a membership at a cost of \$3
- Fill out an entry form and register with the Secretary to receive an exhibitor number. Insert your age
- **See also** Art and Photography Sections and Baking #62 and #65
- During the Fair, **prize money** for Juniors may be picked up by submitting the pink copy of the entry form to the Secretary at the Town Park Recreation Centre. In order to claim your prize money after the Fair please contact the Secretary.
- Exhibits must be received at the Town Park Recreation Centre by **11am** Friday September 18 and picked up on Sunday September 20 between 4:30 and 6 pm
- The same person may not win the Prize Money awarded for the highest points for more than 2 consecutive years. Open Specials are excluded from this rule
- Only one entry per person per class and all work must be done by the exhibitor in the current year and suitably labelled. Parents are urged to allow the children to prepare the exhibit. Please encourage them in every way, but allow them to do the work themselves
- At the discretion of the judge, a 1st or any prize ribbon may not be awarded
- **All baking must be covered with plastic wrap and placed on disposable plates**
- Each entry will receive a ribbon
- In the general categories, judging is based upon creativity and appearance
- Point system for high point prizes: 1st - 3 points, 2nd - 2 points, 3rd - 1 point, 4th - 1 point
- **Prize Money Ages 3 to 13:** 1st \$4, 2nd \$3, 3rd \$2, 4th \$1
- **Prize Money Ages 14 to 17:** 1st \$5, 2nd \$4, 3rd \$3
