Needlework & Fibre Arts Exhibitor Rules

- Please see Exhibitors' Regulations on page 5
- All entries must be received by the Director in charge at the Town Park Recreation Centre by 11 am on Friday September 16 and must be picked up between 4:30 and 6 pm on Sunday September 18
- All entries must be NEW, UNUSED WORK, not previously shown with the exception of #150 Quilt top.
- Entries must be the work of the amateur exhibitor and may only be exhibited at the Port Hope Fair once.
- Only 1 article per class/per person is allowed
- OAAS Judging Standards book is available to exhibitors, for viewing, on request
- Points are awarded as follows: 1st 3 points; 2nd 2 points; 3rd 1 point

Tips for Exhibitors

- Entries will be judged as follows: Creative design, colour and materials 40%, Craftsmanship 45%, General Appearance 15%
- Work should be finished appropriately and be ready for use
- Colour scheme should be harmonious, including background or frame, and should suit the design and use of the article
- Material chosen should suit the article's use and design. **SA = Sample attached**
- Sizes specified do not include frames or optional fringe. Place quilt size on the entry tag
- If you have used a traditional quilting pattern, include the name on the entry tag
- Use safety pins to attach exhibitor entry tags, no straight pins

OAAS Quilt Competitions

Eligibility, Rules and Regulations

- 1 Entry must be judged at the Port Hope Fair
- 2 Entry quilts **must** meet OAAS **size** requirements - see # 158 and # 159.
- 3 The Grand Champion Quilts are entitled to be entered in the 2011 District competition. The winning quilts at this meeting will be eligible to enter the competition at the Provincial Annual Meeting to be held in Toronto in February of 2012
- 4 Upon making an entry into the OAAS Quilt Competition, the exhibitor agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition

158 Grand Champion Machine Quilt:

Made and machine-quilted by the exhibitor. A long arm machine may not be used.

Entries must be a minimum of 48" x 48" or a total of 192" around the perimeter.

May be square, rectangular, round et cetera.

Chosen from the winners in Class 140.

159 Grand Champion Hand-Quilted Quilt:

Made and hand quilted by the Exhibitor

The quilt must be at least 72 x 90" Chosen from the winners in Classes 140, 143 or 144.
