Section H: Handcrafts Department Rules

- Please see Exhibitors' Regulations
- All entries must be brought to the Town Park Recreation Centre by **9 pm** on Thursday September 13 or by **11 am** on Friday September 14, 2018
- Entries must be picked up **on Sunday between 4:30 and 6 pm**
- All entries must be **HANDMADE, NEW, UNUSED WORK**, not previously entered
- Only 1 article per class/per person is allowed
- OAAS Judging Standards Book is available to exhibitors upon request
- Points awarded as follows:
1st prize 3 points; 2nd prize 2 points; 3rd prize 1 point

Tips for Exhibitors

- Entries will be judged as follows: craftsmanship 45%, creative design, colour and materials 40%, general appearance 15%
- Entries should be neat, clean and well-pressed if required
- Work should be finished appropriately and ready for use (mounted, framed or incorporated into accessory for the home)
- Colour scheme should be harmonious, including background or frame, and should suit the design and use of the article
- Material chosen should suit the use of the article and complement the design
