#### How to enter as an exhibitor at the Fair

- 1 Look through this book to see what you might like to enter. The information is the same as in the regular **2019 Fair Book** and on Website **www.porthopefair.com**.
- 2 Prepare your entries.
- 3 Juniors (12 and under) do not pay a membership fee; those 13 to 17 pay \$3.
- 4 An entry form is included in this book for you to fill in. Under "Section" use the letter as shown in this book; such as, J for Juniors, A for Art. The form is also available on our website at www.porthope-fair.com (print two copies)
- 5 Take your entry form to the Secretary at the Town Park Recreation Centre on Tuesday September 10 from 4 to 7pm, Thursday September 12 from 6 to 9pm or Friday September 13 from 8 to 11am. The Secretary will give you an exhibitor number and a tag for each of your entries. You may enter the Children's Pet Show in the South Field and the Pedal Tractor Pull near the tennis courts on Sunday September 15 without pre-registering.
- 6 Bring your entries to the Town Park Recreation Centre on Thursday evening from 7 to 9 pm or on Friday morning. Art and Photography entries must be received by 9pm on Thursday evening. All other entries must be received before 11 am Friday.
- 7 The buildings will be closed to the public during judging and will open Friday at 5 pm. Fill in the second copy of the entry form after the judging is completed and give it to the Secretary on Saturday afternoon.
- 8 Pick up your entries on **Sunday between 4:30 and 5:30 pm.**


#### PET SHOW RULES:




