#### **Needlework & Fibre Arts Section Rules**

- Exhibitors' Regulations on page 5 apply, unless an exception is noted
- All Quilt entries must be received by the Directors in Charge by 9 pm on Thursday September 12th
- All entries must be NEW unused work,
- Entries that are soiled, worn or not the specific size will be disqualified.
- Entries must be the work of the amateur exhibitor, completed during the previous 12 months not previously shown at the Port Hope Fair with the exception of # 11 Quilt top.
- OAAS Judging Standards book is available for exhibitors to review on request
- Points are awarded as follows: 1<sup>st</sup> 3 points; 2<sup>nd</sup> 2 points; 3<sup>rd</sup> 1 point

#### **Tips for Exhibitors**

- Entries will be judged as follows: Creative design, colour and materials 40%, Craftsmanship 45%, General Appearance 15%
- Work should be finished appropriately and be ready for use
- Colour scheme and materials chosen including background or frame should be harmonious and suit the design and use of the item.
  SA = Fabric sample attached
- Sizes specified do not include frames or optional fringe. Place quilt size on the entry tag
- Use safety pins to attach exhibitor entry tags, no straight pins

# **Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Quilt Competitions**

Eligibility, Rules and Regulations

- Entries must be completed in the 12 months prior to the Port Hope Fair (proof may be requested)
- Entry must be judged at the Port Hope Fair
- Entry quilts must meet OAAS size requirements.
- The Grand Champion Quilts are entitled to be entered in the 2019 District competition. The winning quilts at this meeting will be eligible to enter the competition at the Provincial Annual Meeting held in Toronto in February 2020
- Upon making an entry into the OAAS Quilt Competition, the exhibitor agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition

#### 65 Grand Champion Machine Quilt:

Made and machine-quilted by the exhibitor. A long-arm machine may not be used.

Perimeter measurement must be a minimum of 324" May be square, rectangular, round, etc.

#### 66 Grand Champion Hand Quilt:

Made and hand-quilted by the exhibitor. Pattern name to be displayed Perimeter measurement must be a minimum of 324"
